Message from Pastor Lesemann

The Low Battery Light is Flashing...Again

"God is my strength and power..." 2 Samuel 22:33 (NKJV)

It wasn't too long ago I was using my cell phone and it started to beep at me then started to flash it's "low battery" warning. It was time for a recharge. I am seeing that message a lot these days. You see it in all the portable electronic devices we have, media players, cell phones, smart phones, notebooks, laptops, etc. all of these devices often give us a "low battery" message, needing to be charged usually daily! Does that sound familiar?

Is YOUR battery running low? No, I am not talking about your cell phone. Is the "low battery light" of fatigue, depression, gloom or guilt blinking in your life? I know at times it is in mine.

As believers in Christ WE have spiritual batteries that need to be recharged. Rest and relaxing as in a vacation can help but we need more. We need a charging power that only can come from God.

There are a number of ways we have access to this power. We have it through prayer as we go to Him with our thoughts and intercessions. We also have access to His power through His Word as He instructs us, guides us and reminds us of His will for us AND His forgiveness through His Son Jesus. And we have the sacraments of Holy Baptism and of the Lord's Supper to physically receive Him, His forgiveness and His strength. In these ways we are plugged in to the free and limitless power that comes from above that recharges the battery of our faith.

But just having access to the power won't recharge us . . . we have to actually "plug in" - in other words, we need to pray regularly, be in His Word regularly, and come to church regularly! He's always there for us, longing to fill us up!

So if your spiritual batteries are running low, go to God! You don't have to search for that power adaptor or that wall outlet - He is accessible from right where you are!



Executive Director Henry Hardt called the meeting to order at 11:15 am. In the absence of Pastor Lesemann, Hardt read the Pastor's prayer. Approximately 20 were in attendance.

The minutes of the January voters' meeting were approved as previously submitted.

Old Business:

It was suggested that we resolve the issue of what to do with the Thrivent funds after the report of Dave Dose, director of the trustees. Dave then explained that \$26,000 is available so far for a new roof furnace, that bids of \$52,000 and \$55,000 have been offered, and that the electrical work needed which must be finished after the furnace has been installed will cost more than \$18,000. Harlan Matasovsky then made a motion that the present Thrivent funds - \$11,269 contributed during the past three years - be moved to the capital improvement fund. The motion was seconded by Vernon Winterhof and carried with a majority voice vote.

Karen Fletcher went over the treasurer's report, which had been prepared, printed, and handed to attendees on a spreadsheet (attached). She has been able to pay bills in a timely manner and thanked the congregation for their much-needed and much-appreciated support for expensive future needs. Henry Hardt explained that the financial report in each weekend bulletin does not accurately reflect a shortage of funds needed for the budget each month, since only six of the twelve months' \$40,000 budget have passed and since we are not currently funding our custodian's salary.

Harlan Matasovsky reported for the Lay Ministers. He went over Pastor's printed report which each voter had received and explained that Pastor continues to help Grace Lutheran with its meetings and with its Confirmation classes.

No report from the Board of Evangelism or the Board of Christian Education.

Reporting for the Board of Youth, Jerry Johnson told the voters that this board and the Board of Christian Education had been combined, as they are using the same resources. The monthly Banana Bunch Bible studies—with an average attendance of 10—continues successfully. The board is beginning to plan for the National Youth Gathering in San Antonio July 1 through 5, 2013; for the October Junior High Youth Gathering; and for the Senior High Youth Gathering in November, for which a male

counselor is needed. The board is also planning to restructure the next Faith-builders and a curriculum centered on the colors of the church year to culminate with a Colors of Christmas program on Christmas Eve.

As director of the Board of Stewardship, Karen Fletcher went over the distribution of special offerings which had been handed out at the January voters' meeting. She thanked Celeste Cummins, who recently joined the group, for her help.

The report of Dave Dose, director of the Board of Trustees:

- Renae, who has been receiving disability compensation (workman's compensation) since February 27, will continue to do so for another six weeks. Dose thanked the volunteers who have been helping out in her place.
- Renovated, repainted, and built, respectively: the bathroom and the closet in the kitchen and a closet to store the church banners. The broken tiles in the cross outside have been replaced. The lawn has been re-seeded. A high-rise stool has been installed in the men's restroom. New ballasts have been placed in some lights.
- A carpet cleaner has been donated to St. John.
- Two fire extinguishers were obsolete. One has been replaced with a donated \$450; the other must be replaced.
- The Altar Guild has reported the dangerous step off the altar; several ideas have been suggested, and the board will add a brass strip to the edge of the step to eliminate the problem.
- No lines exist for the off-street parking spaces on the south side of the church; Dave will talk to the city manager.
- Work on the west parking lot will begin soon. The concrete has been offered at cost; volunteers are needed to replace the old.
- The estimated cost for the roof furnace is \$55,000—bid by Christensen's; Nepple Electric has bid \$18,000 for the electrical work which must follow.

No report from the Parish Relations Board.

The report from the Endowment Fund has been printed and handed out. Jim Schroeder has been commissioned as the estate planning advisor for St. John. Some mission projects are being considered for the future.

New business:

The parish planning council had handed out for several weeks in advance and for today the nominating committee's list of officers and administrative boards. Two names were added to the Board of Youth, Deb Matasovsky and Donna Dose.

A majority vote approved the nominations.

Some discussion ensued concerning the trustees' February 15 policy for facility use by and fees for St. John members and non-members. A motion was made and seconded to adopt it. The motion passed by a majority voice vote. The contract will be posted outside the church office and is included with these minutes.

A summary of the Iowa District West Convention was printed and handed out to voters.

Suzanne Winterhof reminded St. John members of the birthday of the church organ on September 30 and briefly detailed some special events planned for it.

Hardt adjourned the meeting at 12:06 p.m. and we prayed the Lord's Prayer together.



St. John Policy for Facility Use and Fees

These policies pertain to the use and rental fees for the Fireside Room & Assembly Hall located on the first floor, along with the Fellowship Hall and kitchen located in the basement. Policies for other rooms in the Church Buildings will be discussed on a case by case basis by the Board of Trustees.

The Fireside Room and the Assembly Room will be considered one area for rental fee purposes.

Members of St. Johns may rent the facilities for weddings, anniversaries, open houses, and showers. Other uses will be brought before the Board of Trustees for discussion and approval.

Members of St. John will be able to rent one or all areas for the following janitorial fee.

* \$ 15.00 for one afternoon *or* evening

* \$ 25.00 for using the areas for **both** one afternoon and evening

Members of St. John that have a 50th or greater wedding anniversary may use the facilities Free of Charge.

Nonmembers that would like to rent the facilities must have the approval of the Board of Trustees prior to use. Upon approval the following fee schedule will be used for each one time use.

## **We are the Sheep**

*Isaiah 53:6a "All we like sheep have gone astray;  
we have turned every one to his own way..."*

Maybe some of you had sheep when you were growing up. My dad did. He would tell me stories about the sheep on their farm. When I was growing up, my Pastor had sheep, too, in his back yard. During Confirmation class, he would tell us stories about his sheep. Some of the things I learned about sheep from the stories of my dad and Pastor Drevlow include sheep wander off, get lost, stray from the others, panic easily, are stubborn, and if their head is stuck in a fence, they will just stand there, helpless, until they are rescued. To put it simply, sheep really seem to be pretty dumb and helpless.

Psalm 100:3 tells us, "Know ye that the Lord He is God: it is He that hath made us, and not we ourselves; we are His people, and the sheep of His pasture." I've been called lots of things, but a sheep?? Although, when you think about it, I guess we really do act like sheep. How often do we wander off from God's Word? How many times have we strayed from His will for our lives? How often do we get lost – lost in the world's desires, lost in our own sinful plans, lost from God? How often do we insist on getting our own way? And, how many times have you felt absolutely helpless and just needed to be rescued?

When Craig was ordained as a Pastor, he was given a shepherd's staff. It was to remind him of the staff that the real shepherds carry with them. Shepherds use their staff to protect the sheep from dangerous animals and to guide the sheep so they go where they belong. The curved part is used to rescue the sheep when they have gotten into trouble by falling off a cliff, landing in the water, or getting themselves in a spot where the shepherd can not reach them. It is curved to fit around their neck and bring them back to the fold when they start to stray. It is also used to carry tiny lambs back to their mothers.

God, too, uses His "rod and staff" (Psalm 23:4) with us. It is used as a guide to provide instruction and help to keep us on the right path, but it can also be used to rescue us when we have gone astray. God's form of rescue may come in the shape of trials that are designed to draw us closer to Him, advice from friends, or God's own Word. Whatever form His staff takes on, we can be assured it is there to help us, in the same way the shepherd's staff is there to help the sheep.
