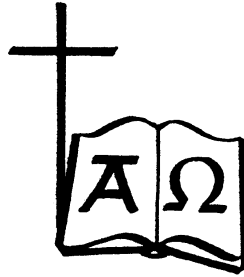

Treasurer's Report - Karen Fletcher

The 2013 Health Reimbursement Account (HRA) amount of \$8000 has been prefunded, thanks in part to memorial monies from Renae Jesse and Ruth Mohr and to the St John tax return.

Approximately \$3000 remains in the treasury to pay current expenses, a situation as good as we've ever been in. The capital improvement fund stands at \$42,489.

The final 2012 monthly social was fun. They will continue in January.

Pastor extended thanks for prayers while he was in the Philippines. He and Todd Roeske, a missionary to the Philippines and to China and a pastor in Alaska, considered their visit very successful.

The next voters' meeting will be Sunday, January 6, 2013 at 11:15 am.

### “What’s the Baby’s Name?”

Babies all have unique stories that they can tell about their birth. One of the things I remember about Sarah’s birth is I could not talk. I *wanted* to. I had all these words, thoughts, and questions going through my mind. I was trying to express them, but no sound was coming out. I opened my mouth to talk several times, but I was silent. A little bit after the baby was born, the doctor asked me, “What’s the baby’s name?” I opened my mouth and out came the word, “Sarah.” The question about the baby’s name broke the spell of my silence!

After I had that experience, the story of Zechariah (the father of John the Baptist) is more meaningful to me. When the angel Gabriel told Zechariah that his wife Elizabeth would have a baby, he was also told that he would not be able to speak until the baby was born (Luke 1:5-25 and 57-66). During his wife’s entire pregnancy, Zechariah was unable to talk! No sound came from him until that moment when the baby was to be named. Then, Zechariah’s voice was restored.

Why did God want Zechariah to be silent during Elizabeth’s entire pregnancy? Was it to provide a whole new meaning to ‘giving your wife the silent treatment?’ ☺ Or was it so Elizabeth didn’t get high blood pressure listening to Zechariah drone on and on about how excited he was about becoming a dad after so many years? Chances are neither of these were the case for Zechariah and Elizabeth. Those 9 months were probably a time of quiet anticipation, eager expectation, and longing as they awaited the birth of their son. Perhaps, the reason was to provide a lesson for us. A lesson that comes down to waiting quietly and patiently in life for God’s timing.

# New in our St. John Lutheran Library

## “THE LUTHERAN STUDY BIBLE”

St. John Library has purchased 22 of these fine newly published Bibles by Concordia Publishing House for use in our Bible Studies here at St. John and have placed 15 of them in the library and 7 in the Fireside Room.

Never before in the history of English-speaking Lutheranism has there been a single-volume edition of the Bible produced like this one with so many features. The aim and goal has been to provide a resource for the lay reader that is comprehensive, devotional, and Christ centered.

It all started with the first Luther Study Bible translated by Martin Luther and published in 1534. Since that time, the LCMS has yearned for an exclusive Lutheran Study Bible to match Martin Luther's which would also include some of his comments that would be printed in English.

Even though the “Concordia Study Bible” is a good Bible printed in 1986, the comments are not all “Lutheran”.

The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod have spent several years working on this project of putting together for the first time, “from the ground up”, printed in English, Lutheran Study Bible making exclusive use of Lutheran notes, commentaries, articles and annotations, including many comments that were included in Martin Luther's “Luther Study Bible” that he translated into German.

May God bless all who use The Lutheran Study Bible so that you “grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity”.

Austin is a 3<sup>rd</sup> grader who enjoys football and baseball as well as swimming at King's Pointe. He likes to play Wii and build things with Legos.

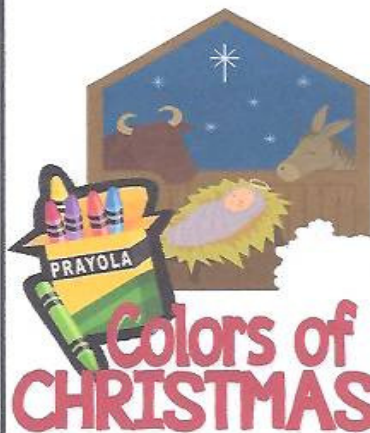

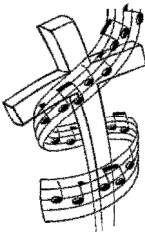
