

Message from Pastor Lesemann

For I Am with You

Be strong, all you people of the land,' declares the LORD, 'and work. For I am with you,' declares the LORD Almighty. HAGGAI 2:4b

The book of Haggai is about the Judean exiles who had returned to Jerusalem. They were given the task of rebuilding the temple but they were struggling with a lack of confidence because of their past sinful fallen ways. Yet God uses Haggai to rally this community of faith to accomplish God's important work. They no doubt were tempted to say "what's the use, this task is too great" or "we aren't worthy of the task" but God encouraged them, "*Be strong, all you people of the land...work, for I am with you.*"

Have the sins of your past affected your work? Have you ever felt like "throwing in the towel?" All of us have at some time been tempted to give up when times get tough. Is that good or bad? At times it may be hard to tell. Of course with these situations, and at all times in life, we need to look at what we are doing through the lens of God's Word. And if we find that our cause or our task is in line with His Word we can take comfort from the above Bible verse from Haggai. "*For I am with you, declares the LORD Almighty.*" He will help us through it!

But, beware! In every area that we strive for success, the devil is also there. He tries to steal our hope. He whispers in our ears "you're going to fail, so give up before you try" or "you're not good enough" or "you're too old" or "God doesn't care." And you could probably add a few other arguments that he has used against you.

Jesus has warned us about Satan's ways. "*...He was a murderer from the beginning, and has nothing to do with the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he lies, he speaks out of his own character, for he is a liar and the father of lies.*" (John 8:44) Remember what we are told in 2 Thessalonians 3:3 "*But the Lord is faithful. He will establish you and guard you against the evil one.*"

We all live with regret, but as repentant believers in Christ, God has given us His grace and forgiveness and adopted us as His own children! You are a child of the King! And because we are His children He has great plans for us! Think of Jeremiah 29:11, "*For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope.*" And Philippians 4:13, "*I can do all things through him who strengthens me.*"

So when you get down on yourself as you do the work which God has set before you, be reminded that His words to the Judean exiles are also for you: "*Be strong, all you people of the land . . . work, for I am with you!*"

Sit back and enjoy the latest adventures of Kristin Matasovsky in Africa.

We finished our first full week of school with minimal furniture, curriculum, and uncompleted classrooms. My students are using tables from the preschool and my desk is a window sill for now. I am praying we get things in place soon—soon being March or April. As far as teaching goes, I am doing just fine. God equipped me with five years of teaching experience that has been so helpful. I feel less stressed being here than I normally do in the States. It helps to not have American expectations looming over your head. I miss life in America, but am enjoying this new life in South Africa for now. It is just what I needed. Plus, every time I look into the eyes of those kids my heart melts.

I was talking with some of them at lunch and as our conversation progressed, I realized that they thought every night I fly home to sleep in America and then fly back to teach them. They were shocked when I said I live in Middelburg. How cute!

More facts for your enjoyment:

Fact #1: Greeting and forming a relationship with people is very important in the African culture. The relationship is enhanced when you learn their names. You can't just say, "Hey..."

I can successfully say all of my students' names. Even the ones with the click sounds (in the Zulu language the letters c, q, and x are clicking sounds). Occasionally, I slaughter one, and they laugh at me, but now I just say them fast and 1) hope they come out right and 2) hope that it was too fast for them to catch the mistake. All the teachers at my school are addressed by saying Teacher (insert first name). So they call me Teacher Kristin in their cute little accents. One day I just might tell them my last name and listen to them try to say it while I laugh at their poor attempts. Haha!

Fact #2: Most people replace water with juice or coke when they need a drink. Things that make you go "Hmmm...": I watched one of the teachers at school dump his Coke all over the windshield of his car and clean it using that. I guess Coke will now be found in the household cleaning section of the local grocery store and the local carwash. **



Fact #3: Everyone drives a manual car here. The other day I asked our school driver if I could “jump at the robot” (that means get out at the next stoplight). What was going to be a quick hop out of the car, turned out to be a little more complicated. First, my door was stuck so I couldn’t open it. He pulled over at a gas station to open it. As I was getting out and as he was walking around the car to get back in, his parking break stopped working and the car started rolling down the hill it was parked on. Mind you, I was getting out of the car. I got stuck in the open door and had to run along with the car, because my upper body was stuck. I thought maybe I could pull a Fred Flintstone and stop this Jeep-like car with my feet, but that didn’t quite work. Luckily, our driver got his door open while running alongside the car and stopped it. Everyone at the gas station was laughing as they watched this white girl, stuck in the door of a car, run alongside the runaway car. That’s right folks, I’ll be here for the next two years. It will happen again.

However, the next day it did happen again. This time I was the only one in the car and everyone else was still outside at school. I started laughing as I saw their shocked faces follow me and the car down the road. I stopped it with the help of the driver. The driver told me he would make a plan to fix it. I know how that goes. There will be a change of plans soon—meaning it won’t get fixed. ☺

Fact #4: I am learning new forms of discipline. I have seen kids have to stand and touch their toes for several minutes on end when they misbehave. But the most intriguing one: three of my students came back from art class with various words written on their forehead in permanent marker. The teacher wrote on their head what they did wrong. I don’t know if I can bring myself to write on their foreheads with permanent marker—but it is quite creative. I already have my idea...stay tuned to find out if it works in future emails.

Tempted, but Not Defeated

Temptations. They are all around us. We are drawn to some things. For many people, it's chocolate or other foods. For others, it's addictions, such as smoking, alcohol, or gambling. Still others are tempted by the desire for money, so they spend countless hours working, away from their families.

Even Jesus was tempted. Right after His Baptism, He "was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil" (Matthew 4:1). The devil tried three separate times to entice Jesus to fall, but each time Jesus refused. And, each time He refused, Jesus used the same approach - He quoted the Bible!

Throughout His trial and crucifixion, Jesus was tempted, too. The tempters took the form of various people. The guards mocked Him and said, "Prophecy! Who hit You?" (Luke 22:64). Caiaphas asked Him, "What is this testimony that these men are bringing against You?" But, Jesus did not answer (Luke 23:9). Pilate, too, asked Him, "Don't You hear the testimony they are bringing against You?" But, Jesus made no reply, not even to a single charge" (Matthew 27:13-14). Even on the cross, the temptations continued. The people, rulers, and soldiers mocked Jesus telling Him to save Himself (Luke 23:35-37). One of the criminals hanging beside Him said, "Aren't You the Christ? Save Yourself and us!" (Luke 23:39). The chief priests, elders, and teachers of the law mocked Him, "He saved others, but He can't save Himself...Let Him come down now from the cross, and we will believe Him" (Matthew 27:41-42).

Talk about temptation!! When someone eggs you on like that, it's easy to get so angry that you want to prove to them that you *can* do the very thing they are saying you *can't* do. Did Jesus know who hit Him? Yes. Could Jesus have answered all the questions they were bringing against Him? Yes. Could Jesus have gotten off the cross and saved Himself? Of course! But, in doing so, he would not have saved us. Jesus' mission was not to prove that He could prophesy, or refute their testimony, or even to save Himself from death. His mission was to save US from death. That is the reason that kept Him quiet. That is the reason that kept Him on the cross.

Hebrews 4:15 tells us that Jesus was "tempted in every way, just as we are - yet was without sin." He was without sin, so He could be sin for us (2 Cor. 5:21). Just as he did

with Jesus, the devil comes to us when we are at our lowest. He tempts us by offering us alternatives around our problems. However, those alternatives are not in our best interest. But, Jesus' faithfulness in the desert and His sacrifice on the cross gives us the power to resist Satan's temptations and proclaim, "Thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ!" (1 Corinthians 15:57).

You will need to call in periodically throughout the year to have Thrivent disperse the funds. Quarterly (January, April, July, & October) would be a good time to do that. However, if you forget to call one month, the funds continue to accrue, so they can be sent the next time you call. 2) If you participated in 2012 and did not designate all of your Choice Dollars, you have until March 31, 2013 to designate those funds or they will expire.


