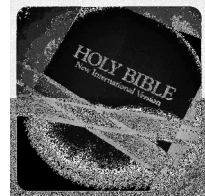

Message from Pastor Lesemann

“...because your heart was penitent, and you humbled yourself before the Lord...I also have heard you, declares the Lord.” 2 Kings 22:19

Do you remember the movie *Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade*? In that movie they searched for the Holy Grail, the supposed chalice Jesus used when He instituted the Lord's Supper. It led them to a hidden monastery, Petra, where they had to face three challenges in order to find the Grail. The first major test in reaching the Holy Grail was coming to an understanding of this clue: “Only the penitent man will pass.” After several others lost their heads, it became clear to Indiana Jones that he had to kneel to get past the deadly traps that were set. So is that all there is to it? Does simply kneeling make one penitent?

Many in this world also do not understand what true penitence is all about. Even worse, many people have little or no knowledge or understanding of sin, let alone any feeling of genuine remorse over it. In fact many today have dismissed the concept of sin as archaic. And through repeated sinning, many have deadened their consciences so that they feel little or no sorrow over their transgressions of God's Law. Needless to say they are not penitent.

The penitential season of Lent will soon begin where we will reflect on sin and its consequence. We will meditate on what Jesus Christ suffered for us because of our sins and what His perfect obedience to the Father, even unto death on the cross, means for us.

To help us also better understand penitence our midweek Lenten series this year will use the seven Penitential Psalms of the Bible. My prayer is that these services will help us trust and rejoice all the more in God's gracious deliverance from the punishment for sins through faith in His Son Jesus Christ.

And even though being penitent is first to despair over sin, in repentance we can immediately remember and be comforted with the wonderful Gospel news of Jesus! He took our sins to the cross, died and rose again! Through penitence and faith we are forgiven, having victory over death and the grave, with the gift of eternal life waiting for us!

THRIVENT MEMBERS: Have you heard about **Action Teams**? If you are a benefit member of Thrivent, you can create an Action Team to help an organization or needy person. (Ex: hold a soup supper to raise funds for a food pantry, clean up a community "eyesore," make pillowcase dresses for missions, etc.) You will be given a \$250 Visa gift card to be the "seed money" to buy the necessary supplies. One of the regulations is "One Action team – one Project;" multiple teams cannot do the same project. Applications are made on-line. You have 90 days to complete the project and file the proper reports. Each Thrivent member is allowed the opportunity to do two projects a year. 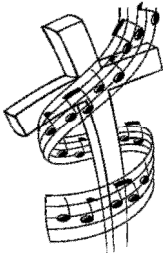
