

Be in the Word

Message from Pastor Lesemann

Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you. 1 Peter 5:7

Over and over I am reminded of God's continued activity in my life. But it is not a lesson that I learn once and then never forget. It is actually the exact opposite. I always need to be reminded that God IS active in my life. That He DOES know of my problems and the things I am struggling with and He DOES get me through them.

Presently I am over committed. You have probably been there yourself. You've committed yourself to a project or a committee or board of some kind. Then you find out it is more work than you thought. Then instead of saying NO to any other work you take on more commitments. Then something unexpected happens and you find yourself even MORE busy. I won't even get into how this affects family time.

So the question is then, what do you do? Well, if you are like me, and I hope you are not, you begin to worry. You worry and worry until God reminds you, either through His Word or through a fellow brother or sister in Christ, that He wants to help you with what you are doing AND that He wants you to trust in Him. It means giving whatever is bothering you to the Lord. Too bad it's used as a "last resort."

Abraham Lincoln once said, "I have been driven many times to my knees by the overwhelming conviction that I had nowhere else to go." Sadly that is the way I have been at times with my worries. I have acted as if it was a last resort, as I had no where else to go so I finally took my problems to the Lord. But Luther had a quite different attitude about the work he had to do. He did not try to do it all himself, but rather his advice was quite the opposite. He said, "If I fail to spend two hours in prayer each morning, the devil gets the victory through the day. I have so much business I cannot get on without spending three hours daily in prayer." So, what is Luther trying to tell us? Pray first instead of last!

Here is one more quote from Martin Luther. "Prayer is not overcoming God's reluctance, but laying hold of His willingness." You see, God is ready and willing to help us through our problems. In fact, He YEARNs to hear from us and to help us because He loves us! That is why He sent His Son Jesus. Isn't that wonderful?

Let us do our best to remember that then next time we are "over committed" and worrying!

Hopes to find interest in visiting one of the St. John missionary families for their presentation at Mission Central in July.

Board of Parish Relations - Linda Zabloudil (present but no report)

Board of Youth and Board of Education - Jerry Johnson

The Banana Bunch will start up again in July. The youth will soon begin planning for the national Youth Gathering in San Antonio in July 2013.

The Board of Education is making plans for restructuring Faithbuilders in the fall with a fun and crazy curriculum called "So What's in the Bible?" with Buck Denver. Vacation Bible School went well. An average and consistent attendance of 76 pre-kindergarteners through 4th graders also raised more than \$700 for LAMP (Lutheran Association of Missionaries and Pilots). This board is already working on the Christmas Eve service.

Board of Stewardship - Karen Fletcher

Karen handed out a printed report on designated offerings and needed capital improvement funds (included in the newsletter).

Treasurer's Report - Karen Fletcher

Checking account has a current balance of \$5000; Thrivent monies are now over \$11,000; capital improvement account is up to \$26,500. Karen's half-year report will be presented at the July voters meeting and will be printed in the July newsletter.

Pastor Lesemann

Carmen Nikoley (Methodist Manor) is officially a new member.

The second pastor called by Grace Lutheran has declined; thus, Pastor's vacancy pastorship will continue for six weeks.

The elders have initially approved giving Pastor Steve Benson, chaplain for the Sioux City hospitals, a \$10 to \$15 donation to support his ministry whenever he visits the St. John sick there. This is a large reduction of the \$60-\$70 mileage which would need to be paid to Pastor for the same.

Pastor hopes to attend a continuing education class in Des Moines July 6-8.

Executive Director - Henry Hardt

Betty Ploeger has stepped down as co-treasurer for St. John. Renae continues on medical leave, the length of which is uncertain.

At the July votersq meeting: as %unfinished business+ attendees will again discuss Thrivent funds, in %new business+ will elect directors and their boards, will clarify the policy concerning the use of St. John building by members, will hear a report on the Iowa District West convention and also a State of the Parish report.

No Parish Planning meeting in July; the next will be Sunday, August 19 at 11:15 am.

Hardt adjourned the meeting at 11:45 am. We closed by praying the Lord's Prayer.

Be Prepared

“No one knows about that day or hour, not even the angels in Heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father.” (Mark 13:32)

These words are written about Judgment Day when Christ will come again. However, they also ring true for each of us as we contemplate our own individual judgment day (the day we will die).

Last month, my article was called “Happy Father’s Day.” It encouraged you to appreciate your father and wish him a Happy Father’s Day. I also told about how special my own dad was to me. While dad was able to see the article I’d written, I was not able to spend Father’s Day with him this year. My dad died between 1:30 ó 1:50 pm two days before Father’s Day, so he was able to spend Father’s Day in Heaven with his earthly father and his Heavenly Father.

The words of Mark 13:32 came to my mind as I thought about what to write this month. They reminded me of when I saw my dad sitting at his desk at 12:30 pm the day he died.

At 12:30, if I had known what would happen a little over an hour later, what would I have done? How would I have reacted and coped? Would I have started crying? Would I have pleaded with God to make dad better and give him more time? Would I have called the ambulance and insisted the doctors do anything to stop his death? If I had only knowní

What if we *would* know the date and time of our death? Would it change the way you were living if you knew you only had 1 hour left to spend on this earth? How would you spend it?

But, ours is not to know the when and how of when our loved ones will die. Our job is to accept it as God’s will and to move on in love knowing it was for their best. Although we can certainly grieve, mourn, and cry (even Jesus did that upon hearing of Lazarus’ death, see John 11:1-45), we all must come to the end of our journey at some point. When we do, we will be welcomed into the eternal and everlasting peace of Heaven.

Thank you to everyone who has responded to me with such love, kindness, and sympathy following my dad’s death. I appreciate all the cards and memorials that were given in memory of him. Although we knew his death was coming, when you lose someone you love it is never easy. I will weep and mourn the death of this very special person in my life, while at the same time I am comforted knowing that dad heard the voice of his Savior and is now living with Him in Heaven.
