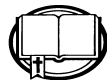

Message from Pastor Lesemann

Spring is Right Around the Corner

"Let us acknowledge the LORD; let us press on to acknowledge him. As surely as the sun rises, he will appear; he will come to us like the winter rains, like the spring rains that water the earth." Hosea 6:3

CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP SOCIETY

Do you find it difficult to confess your Christian faith when those around you think otherwise? Is it easier to keep quiet and go along with the crowd? Those were issues that surfaced as the Christian Fellowship Society viewed the movie, "God's Not Dead," at its meeting January 25. It also made us realize the impact that just one willing to speak up for the faith can have.

Harlan Matasovsky led opening devotions, and refreshments were served by Donna Truelsen and Lois Lytle. We were happy to have three guests join us for the evening.

LADIES' AID

Beautifully decorated Valentine cookies were served by Barb Haynes when the Ladies' Aid met on February 4. Pastor Lesemann led the opening devotions and presented the topic based on information he had received at a recent district mission workshop. He shared statistics that while a majority of Americans consider themselves Christians, many are "unchurched." One survey considered an "unchurched" person as someone who had not attended a worship service in the last six months, and it showed 38% of people living in Buena Vista County are "unchurched." He outlined these actions that can be taken by every member:

Pray that the Holy Spirit will work faith in the hearts of the unchurched

Pray for the pastors and church leaders

Pray for laborers who are willing to "work in the harvest"

Pray that you yourself will have a passion for the lost

Pray for a vision on how to best reach these people

Twelve members answered roll call by relating their favorite indoor winter activity which ranged from reading, needlework, watching sports TV, and when desperate, house-cleaning!

Human Care Chair Marge Manteufel reported that over 2000 pounds of clothing, quilts, and mats had been delivered to Orphan Grain Train. The group resolved to give \$50 toward the Biblesticks for Military collection. We are working to provide items needed at the 2015 National Convention for the Service Projects. Our closing meditation focused on the National LWML Grant to Lutheran Public Radio.

MORE CFS NEWS

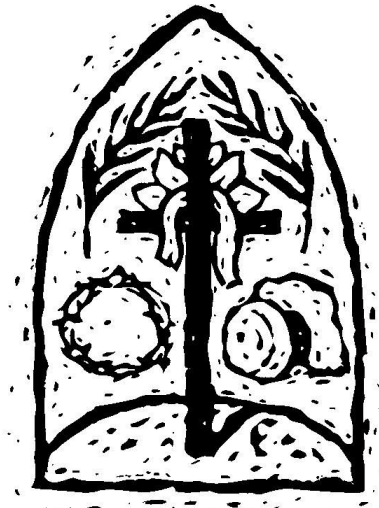
Nineteen members were present at the February meeting of CFS. Ray Mittelstadt's opening devotion asked the question, "What is Lent?" He reminded us that the Christian religion is the only one where God suffers for His people; most religions try to appease their gods and demand work-righteousness. That is why the Cross is at the center of our worship. We need the time of Lent to fully experience Easter joy.

The Fellowship Society was given a gift designated for mission work. The group decided to use this gift as a matching fund challenge to the youth who are gathering funds for an African mission: The Fellowship Society will match the youth's gift dollar for dollar up to \$200. The group also voted to help finance the Sudanese Mission Society dues.

The program for the evening was presented by David and Donna Dose who showed pictures and talked of their experience as Petal Pushers a year ago. They detailed the tedious labor that goes into building a float for the Rose Bowl Parade, but also the joy of knowing that your labor was recognized by producing a trophy winner. Their trip to the Los Angeles area included mission work at a homeless shelter on Skid Row.

Refreshments were served by Milt Swain (the Norwegian chef) and Lloyd Bumann.

Our Failure, His Success

The winner of the World Series. America's most handsome man. The multi-million dollar lottery winner. We remember those names because they are successful. But, what about the team that lost the World Series? Or the second most handsome man? Who were they? Chances are no one remembers (unless it was you or your favorite team)! In a word, they were failures. Nobody cares about the underdog...or do they?

In *The Message* translation of the Bible, Isaiah 53:2-5a reads, "The servant grew up before God – a scrawny seedling, a scrubby plant in a parched field. There was nothing attractive about him, nothing to cause us to take a second look. He was looked down on and passed over, a man who suffered, who knew pain firsthand. One look at him and people turned away. We looked down on him, thought he was scum. But the fact is, it was *our* pains he carried – *our* disfigurements, all the things wrong with *us*. We thought he brought it on himself, that God was punishing him for his own failures. But it was our sins that did that to him, that ripped and tore and crushed him – *our sins!*"

It *was* our failures that brought Jesus into the world. It was because of all the times we failed to do what we should have done or did what we should not have done that Jesus came into the world (Romans 7:19). God cared enough about our failures to send Jesus to erase them and clean us up. It reminds me of when kids draw on a dry erase board (a white board like the one on my office door). No matter what kind of a mess they have made or how many colors they have blended together, when they are done, you just erase it and it's clean again. Those drawings are like the failures (mistakes, sins) we have committed. Our white board was full of errors and a big mess, but God sent Jesus to wipe it all clean. Our multitude of failures and mistakes became His success. Because we could never get it "right," God sent Jesus to be successful for us.

"God made Him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God" (2 Corinthians 5:21). Praise God that He cared about us underdogs and covered our failures with Jesus' success!

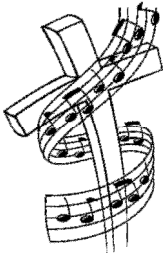
