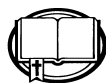

Message from Pastor Lesemann

Is There Such a Thing As Coincidence?

“Jacob’s well was there, and Jesus, tired as he was from the journey, sat down by the well. It was about noon. When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, “Will you give me a drink?” (John 4:6-7 NIV)

I remember Esther Linge telling me about a book she recommended to me, titled “When God Winks at You” by Squire Rushnell (I have yet to read it). I have found though that it is the author’s opinion that God speaks directly to us through the power of coincidence. He calls things that seem to be coincidences “Godwinks,” illustrating that God is very much a part of our every day lives. Nothing is a coincidence! Here is one of the example stories of that book.

“In Anaheim, California, Mavis Jackson drove past the Crystal Cathedral. For twenty years, she said the same thing: “Someday I’m going to go there.” One Sunday morning, she did. Putting on her best outfit, she simply decided, “Today is the day.” Getting there early, Mavis took a seat in the middle and watched the huge three thousand-seat megachurch fill with people. She was awed as the majestic voices of the choir seemed to encircle her. She marveled at the manner in which a huge section of the glass ceiling slid open at the start of the worship as if to invite even the birds to worship. At the end of the service, Mavis stood up and waited for the aisle to clear. Trying not to sound too excited, she said to the young lady next to her, “I am so glad I came today. Wasn’t it wonderful?” The young woman nodded. “Are you from here?” asked Mavis. “No, I’m from the Midwest,” said the young woman adding, “I’m actually here on a mission. To find my birth mother.” There was a pause. “I know how you must feel,” said Mavis. “A long time ago, I had to give up a little girl for adoption. I didn’t want to...but...” Another pause. The young woman looked deeply into Mavis’s eyes. “Do you...remember her birthday?” “Yes,” said Mavis cautiously. “October 30th.” “That’s my birthday,” gasped the young woman. They sat down and shared with each other what had brought them to that moment.”

Just like the Bible verse of the woman at the well, God is a part of every “coincidental” meeting. In truth, Jesus intentionally wanted to be there at that time and that place with that woman to intentionally show her that He cared for her deeply and wanted her to trust in Him and know His forgiveness given through the promised Messiah. It was NO coincidence.

The same goes for us! The next time something that seems to happen out of coincidence in your life, think of it as God’s winking at you to show you – in a unique and special way – that He is actively involved in every detail of your life.

Hidden Things

Has anyone ever hidden something from you? Maybe one of your kids did something they knew you would not approve of, so they kept it a secret from you. Perhaps, you were betrayed by someone who concealed behaviors or lies from you. Or maybe someone had a surprise they were not ready to tell you about...

This last one was the case for my sister, Jodelle, and I on August 6, 1981. My mom had a tradition of putting a bow on the mailbox whenever a new grandchild was born: pink for a girl or blue for a boy. As mom searched in her dresser drawer for the bow, my sister and I repeatedly asked, "Is it a boy or a girl?" and "Which bow are you looking for?" The longer she took, the more anxious and frustrated we became. Why didn't she just answer our questions and tell us if it was a boy or a girl?? Finally, the pink bow emerged from the drawer. My sister and I started jumping up and down, screaming. It was a long-awaited niece (at 10 years old and after 3 nephews, you can imagine my excitement! Sookie remains my only niece, so I'm still pretty excited about her) ☺

The story of my mom concealing my niece's identity from my sister and I reminds me of God and how He often keeps things hidden from us, too. How often are we, like my sister and I, repeatedly asking God, "Why?" We often question Him for a reason or for an answer. But, just like my mom's behavior, God remains silent, never revealing His motives.

Proverbs 25:2a tells us, "It is the glory of God to conceal a matter..." The footnote in *The Lutheran Study Bible* (p. 1038) for this verse reads, "God's glory is manifested in many ways, e.g., creation, intervention in history, and, specifically, human redemption through His Son. Yet His ways and will are often hidden from human comprehension." Often, God conceals things (or hides things) from us. We cannot explain how He created the world, the miracle of conception and birth, or how we will rise from the dead (or thousands of other questions we ponder each day). God has chosen not to reveal those answers to us. It is a surprise that still awaits us, much like that long-awaited pink bow was for Jodelle and I.

He said he has a new missionary family who is currently desperate for funds to take them to mainland China, where they will go to remote areas to teach lay people how to share the message of salvation. The missionary's name is Pastor Charles St. Onge and his wife, Deb. They have two little girls, Olivia and Sophia who will be home schooled by their mother. They are originally from the Houston, Texas area. We will be sending Mission Central a check of \$1,000.00 to help these folks to serve. Please pray that these funds will be put to good use and this family will be safe during their stay in China. I will transfer the balance of \$1,270.63 to the Capital Improvement Fund this week where we are continuing to save for future needed improvements. 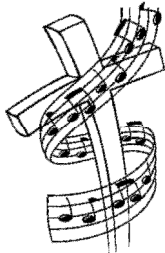
